# **First Anniversary Issue**

The first EMBLEM Newsletter was published one year ago. On this first birthday, we take a look back at the progress of the year.

EMBLEM Uganda had enrolled their first few cases of BL in November 2010. They have now not only enrolled a total of 67 cases, but have also enrolled some 210 controls from both community and health centers. The control enrollment is the fruit of both the census taking which involved 7500 people

and the village sensitization efforts put forth in 12 districts. EMBLEM Uganda has also, along with Kenya, held Community Advisory Board meetings. Tanzania and Kenya EMBLEM teams have both arrived at the starting line for case enrollment, with both the laboratory and staff in place.

EMBLEM took its first steps on the international scene during the 3 day biannual AORTIC Conference in Cairo, Egypt a few weeks ago. A special session on NCI funded research highlighted the EMBLEM study and included presentations on preparation and implementation activities of the study. #### **EMBLEM TANZANIA**

Final lab renovation was completed at Bugando Medical Center in Mwanza. The freezer, hood and centrifuge were installed, with microscope and QBC machine to follow. Major purchasing of lab supplies, office supplies, and office equipment was completed for all sites, including the Shirati site. Visibility of EMBLEM increased greatly with printing and posting of EMBLEM signs and posters at the office in the oncology ward.

### **EMBLEM KENYA**

Some EMBLEM Kenya Co-Investigators attended and presented at the AORTIC Conference which took place in Cairo, Egypt.

EMBLEM Kenya held its first workshop for the Community Advisory Board (CAB) members, who were given information about the EMBLEM Study, EMBLEM structure, and roles and functions of the CAB. The CAB members were each awarded a certificate of attendance.

The EMBLEM Project was officially launched in Homabay on 16<sup>th</sup> December 2011 and the

### **EMBLEM UGANDA**

One of the most important activities in the EMBLEM Study is storage of samples from participants. To maintain the integrity of these samples, they need to be stored at very low temperatures. The Thermofischer team completed installation of a  $\rm CO_2$  Backup system for the freezer at EMBLEM Lacor. Enrollment of controls from Paloga Health Center and Barr Health Center continued with enrollment figures reaching 18 (07F,11M) and 08 (03F,05M), respectively. To date, 132 cases (42F and 90M) have been screened, and 67 (20F and 47M) have been enrolled.

The regular community advisory Board (CAB) meetings took place at EMBLEM Lacor, but this time with the presence of the Principal Investigator.
